Objectives - Participants will understand:

Medicaid Overview

1. the statutory and regulatory background of Medicaid.
2. that Medicaid requires coverage of certain populations and services, while others are optional.
3. the basic financing of Medicaid.
4. how the state administers regular medical, behavioral health and long-term care services under Medicaid.

Medicaid Eligibility

1. the process for application for Medicaid or Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) coverage.
2. the basic income levels set for families and children to achieve Medicaid and CHIP eligibility.
3. the process for application for Medicaid coverage.
4. the basic income levels set for the elderly and individuals with disabilities to achieve Medicaid eligibility.
5. the concepts of Protected Income Limit (PIL), spenddown, and patient liability.
6. presumptive medical disability and how it works.

Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Eligibility*

1. the process for application for Medicaid coverage when the individual is seeking HCBS.
2. the basic income levels set for individuals who want to receive HCBS.
3. the concepts of protected income limit (PIL) and client obligation.
4. how functional eligibility works for individuals who want to receive HCBS.

*This course will not cover specific HCBS waiver services.

History of KS Medicaid Managed Care

1. the long history of Medicaid managed care in Kansas, including the legislative requirement for it.
2. how various Medicaid populations and geographic regions were included in managed care.
3. the differences and similarities between KanCare (today's Medicaid managed care) and earlier Medicaid managed care programs.
