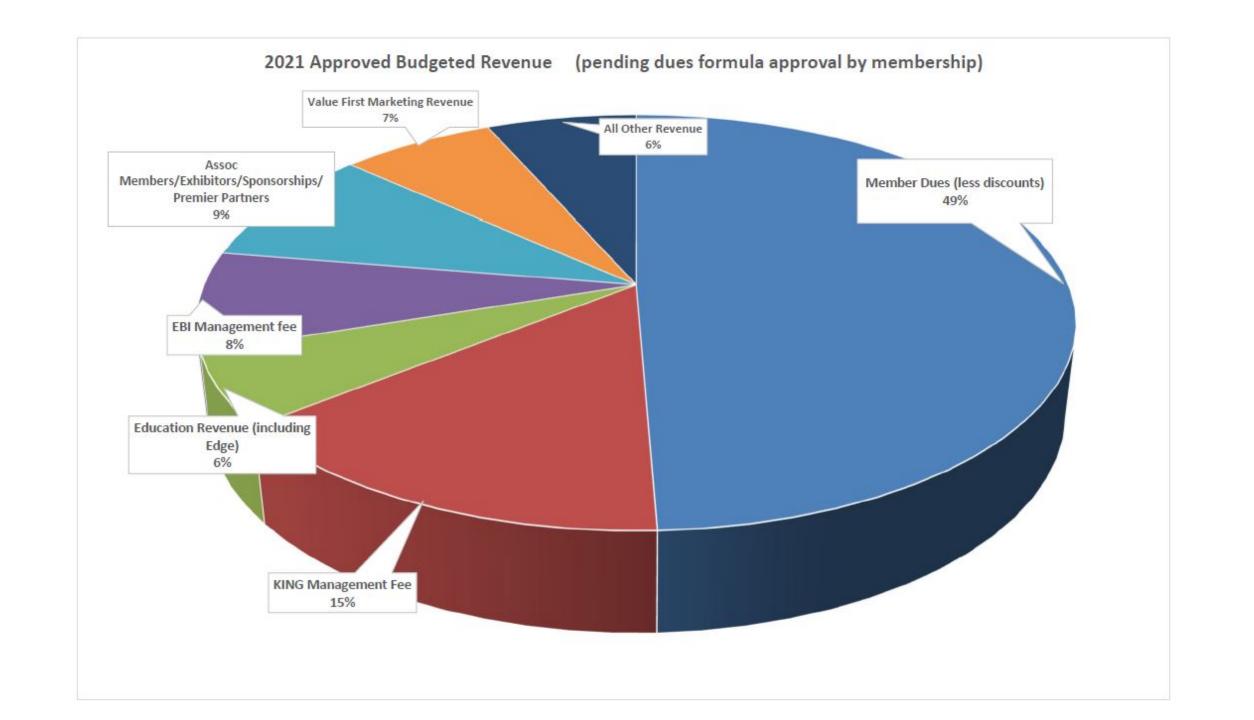

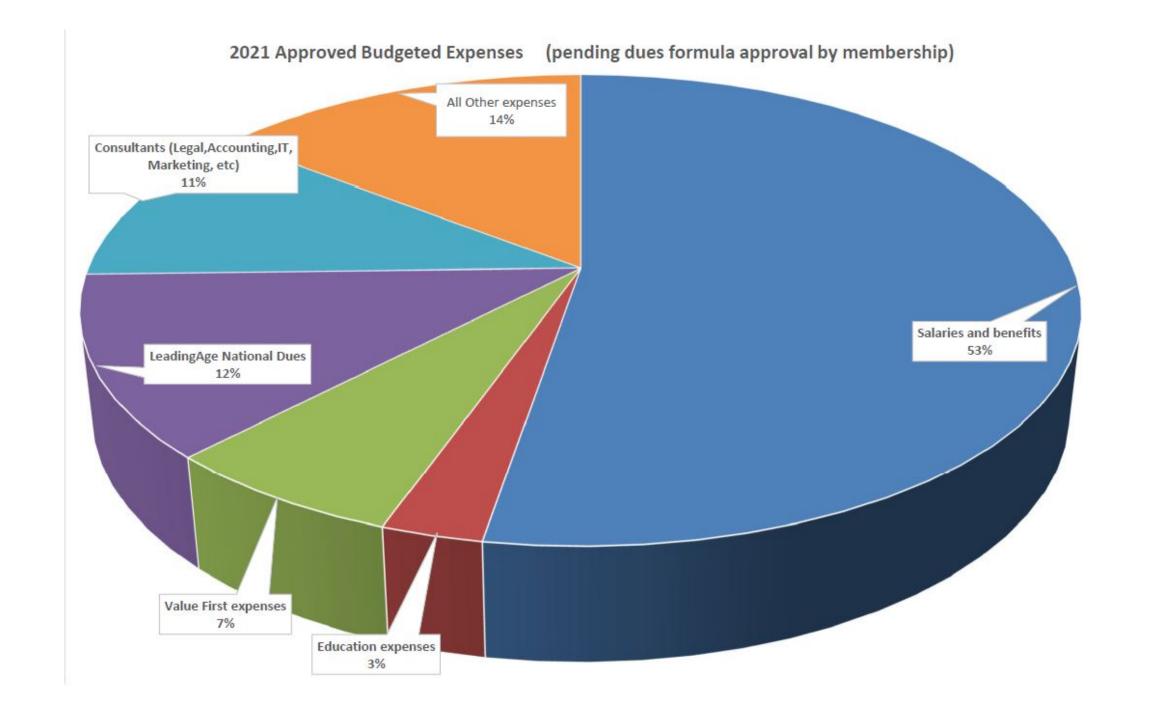

#### 2021 Proposed Dues Formula as recommended by the Board

**STEP 1** National Dues is a tiered band structure based on operating revenue. Instituted in dues year 2019.

Adult Day	flat fee	\$200
Hospice	50% off band	(900)

**STEP 2** State Dues are LeadingAge National dues X 2.6 (Background: this multiplier was originally approved at 2.8. In 2010 it was lowered to 2.45. In 2017 it was adjusted to 2.6. The Board recommends keeping the 2.6 multiplier for 2020.)

Step 1 + 2 = TOTAL

- New member phase-in dues
