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PDPM: Implementation Steps Background

- New Medicare NF Classification System for PPS
 - Replaced RUG IV
 - Broke apart pieces that were bundled under RUGs
 - Ramifications for Medicaid programs
- Includes Nursing Component Similar to RUGs
 - $\bullet\,$ This is the component most applicable to Medicaid
 - Will likely resemble moving to a new version of RUGs

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PDPM: Implementation Steps Implications for Medicaid

- CMS Will Stop Supporting RUGs at Some Point
 - Originally planned to stop collecting some data this fall
 - Those changes were delayed but no new date given
- OSAs Could be Used to Collect Missing Data
 - CMS created Optional State Assessments so states could collect missing data
 - Using these requires matching to other assessments
- Eventually PDPM Will Be State of the Art System
 - PDPM will become a best practice for case mix systems

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PDPM: Implementation Steps Original Kansas Plan

- Based on RUGs Being Unsupported After 10/1/20
- Planned to Use OSAs Starting 7/1/20
 - State would have used the OSAs to collect section G and other data elements needed for RUG calculations
 - Matching this data to other assessment data would have allowed the state to continue RUG calculations
- PDPM Data Would Start Accumulating 10/1/20
 - PDPM data is currently only collected on Medicare 5day assessments

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PDPM: Implementation Steps CMS Changes/Revised Plan

- CMS Delayed 10/1/20 Changes
 - Will continue collecting section G/other RUG items
 - Gave states the option to add PDPM items (section GG)
- RUGs Support Will Continue But Not Indefinitely
 - State will still have the option to use OSAs to collect section G and other data elements if needed in the future
- PDPM Data Will Start Accumulating 10/1/20
 - Kansas has decided to require PDPM data elements beginning 10/1/20

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PDPM: Implementation Steps Challenges

- Case Mix System Basics
 - Relies on matching acuity data to cost report periods
 - Rates are then adjusted to match Medicaid acuity for the rate period
- Three Year Base Period Creates Challenge
 - Three years of PDPM data would have to accumulate to be able to match acuity data to the cost report periods

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PDPM: Implementation Steps Challenges

- COVID-19 Distortions
 - Increased costs & decreased census will distort data
 - Case mix values may also be distorted
- Other Options May Need to be Considered
 - Using a one-year base period may be beneficial



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Kansas Nursing Home Reimbursement Update: PDPM Recap

- PDPM Implementation Steps
 - CMS changes made implementation easier
 - RUGs based system will continue but not indefinitely
 - It will take considerable time to accumulate PDPM data
