LeadingAge Conducts Press Conference on July 29th

On July 29th, we conducted another in a series of national press conferences. Early media coverage included the following:

Act for Older Adults Campaign

In mid-June, LeadingAge launched "Act for Older Adults," an advocacy campaign demanding Five Essential Actions for older adults and staff in nursing homes, assisted living, affordable housing, hospice, home health and community-based services. We're directing four of those demands to Congress as it takes up a new COVID-19 relief package:

- Ample and appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE),
- On-demand testing,
- Funding for aging services providers and
- Better support for frontline workers.

The fifth demand—that states consider older Americans' health and safety as they reopen—falls into your sphere of influence. Guidance about reopening is unclear, ever-changing and even conflicting, whether it is coming from the national, state or local level.

LeadingAge will continue our advocacy to advance these essential actions. But we need our members to send a clear message to your policymakers: states cannot reopen safely without a proper virus response strategy in place. The lives of all—especially the lives of older adults—depend on it.
